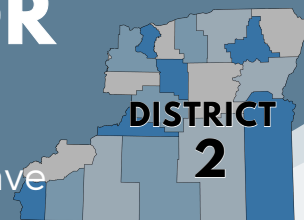


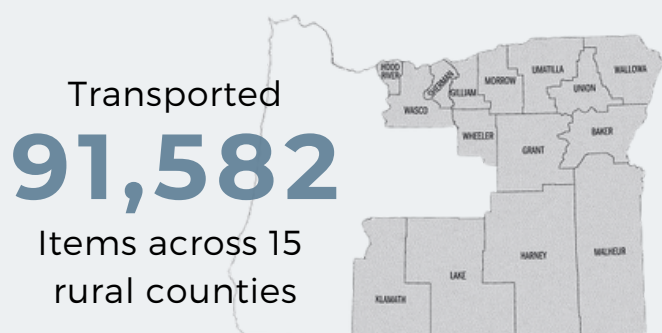
VIBRANT LIBRARY SERVICES FOR OREGONIANS

Jackson County Library Services installed an outdoor book locker in Shady Cove expanding access to library materials for rural residents.

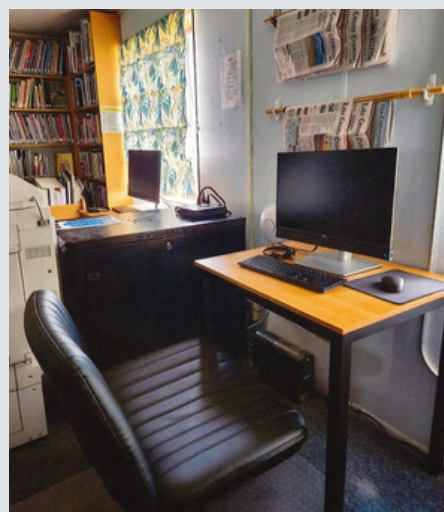

Lake County Library District upgraded its network and installed new computers, charging stations, and furniture at the Christmas Valley branch, enhancing internet access for users.

Wasco County Library Service District created a private space for patrons to engage in confidential online appointments and meetings, improving access to critical services like legal consultations and virtual job interviews.

Hannon Library at Southern Oregon University helped address textbook affordability by promoting open educational resources and expanding the library's course materials collection, ensuring greater access to learning materials for students and faculty.
